Novak Djokovic está cerca de lograr su undécimo título en el Abierto de Australia, pero primero debe superar a dos jóvenes retadores, Carlos Alcaraz y Jannik Sinner. La ruta del serbio hacia la victoria parece estar despejada, pero estos dos jugadores podrían ser sus principales obstáculos. El sorteado del torneo ha generado varios puntos de interés, incluyendo la posible confrontación entre Djokovic y Sinner en las semifinales. El italiano ha demostrado su habilidad en el pasado, salvando puntos de partido contra Djokovic en Malaga después de dividir los encuentros en la ATP Finals en Turín. Por otro lado, Alcaraz, el campeón de Wimbledon, ha optado por no participar en torneos previos y se ha estado preparando en prácticas y partidos de exhibición antes de su regreso al Abierto de Australia. El número dos del mundo había perdido el evento del año pasado debido a una lesión en el tendón de la pierna, pero luego agregó un segundo título importante en el All England Club en julio. La competencia por el título masculino promete ser intensa, con otros jugadores como Stefanos Tsitsipas, Matteo Berrettini y Ben Shelton también buscando hacer su marca en el torneo. The Australian Open is just around the corner, with many big names ready to take to the court at Melbourne Park. Carlos Alcaraz, the reigning US Open champion, could face Daniil Medvedev in the semifinals if he makes it that far, or potentially Alexander Zverev in the quarterfinals. Meanwhile, Alex de Minaur is looking to break his fourth-round curse and make a deeper run at home after becoming Australia's top 10 ranked player since Lleyton Hewitt in 2006. De Minaur will have a tough opener against Milos Raonic, but if he can get past him, he might face Andrey Rublev in the fourth round. This could be an interesting matchup, given their head-to-head record of 3-2 in favor of De Minaur. Grigor Dimitrov has been performing well recently and took home his first trophy since 2018 with a win over top seed Holger Rune at Brisbane International. He reached the semifinals in 2017 and could potentially face Medvedev in the fourth round or have a rematch with Rune in the quarterfinals. Despite being seeded 13th, Dimitrov has shown he can compete with the best, including beating Alcaraz last year. The Australian Open is set to kick off on January 14, marking the beginning of the 2024 Grand Slam season on the Hologic WTA Tour. The tournament will feature a 128-player singles field and will be played over 15 days for the first time in its history. Late finishes will be a thing of the past as the Australian Open adds an extra day to its schedule, ensuring fair and equitable matches on the stadium courts, according to Tournament Director Craig Tiley. The additional day will benefit both fans and players. The tournament format remains unchanged: all singles, doubles, and mixed doubles matches will be played in a best-of-three tiebreak format. If the third set reaches 6-6, a 10-point tiebreaker will be played for singles and doubles, while mixed doubles will feature a 10-point tiebreaker instead of a third set. Finals dates have been announced: the singles final will take place on Saturday, January 27 at 7:30 p.m., the doubles final on Sunday, January 28 at 3 p.m., and the mixed doubles final on Friday, January 26 at noon. Defending champions Aryna Sabalenka and Barbora Krejcikova will look to repeat their victories in singles and doubles, respectively. Last year's winners swept titles in Adelaide and Melbourne. The top seeds for this year's tournament are based on a player's WTA singles ranking as of Monday, January 8. The top 16 seeds are: Iga Swiatek, Aryna Sabalenka, Elena Rybakina, Coco Gauff, Jessica Pegula, Ons Jabeur, Marketa Vondrousova, Maria Sakkari, Barbora Krejcikova, Beatriz Haddad Maia, Jelena Ostapenko, Zheng Qinwen, Liudmila Samsonova, Daria Kasatkina, Veronika Kudermetova, and Caroline Garcia. The main draw features a strong lineup, with notable first-round matchups including Osaka-Garcia, Swiatek-Kenin, Kerber-Collins, Rybakina-Pliskova, Giorgi-Azarenka, Linette-Wozniacki, Kasatkina-Stearns, Raducanu-Rogers, Anisimova-Samsonova, Badosa-Townsend, and Pavlyuchenkova-Vekic. Prize money and ranking points are on offer throughout the tournament. Top contenders for the upcoming Australian Open include Coco Gauff, a 19-year-old American with 7 titles and a strong recent record of 5-0 in 2024. Her best performance at the tournament was reaching the Round of 16 in both 2020 and 2023. Jessica Pegula, a 29-year-old American, also boasts an impressive record of 5 hard-court titles, including her most recent win in Seoul in 2023. She has reached the Quarterfinals three times since 2021 and is currently playing in Adelaide with a 3-1 record in 2024. Ons Jabeur from Tunisia, who stands at 29 years old, has 5 titles under her belt but only 1 on hard courts, which she achieved in Ningbo last year. Her best performance in the Australian Open was reaching the Quarterfinals in 2020. Marketa Vondrousova of the Czech Republic, aged 24, has 2 titles to her name and a recent win in Biel in 2017. In the Australian Open, she reached the Third Round in 2021 but lost to Lin Fruhvirtova last year. Maria Sakkari from Greece, who is 28 years old, has 2 titles including one on hard courts which was won in Guadalajara last year. She has also had success at the Australian Open, reaching the Third Round twice. Barbora Krejcikova of the Czech Republic, aged 28, boasts an impressive 7 titles and a strong record on hard courts with 5 recent wins including one in San Diego this year. Her best performance in the tournament was reaching the Quarterfinals in 2022. Beatriz Haddad Maia from Brazil, who is 27 years old, has 4 titles but only one of them was won on a hard court last year in the WTA Elite Trophy. She reached the Second Round twice at the Australian Open before being eliminated by Nuria Parrizas Diaz last year.
